


Executive Order 13158 directs NOAA and DOI to create a US national system of MPAs that:


- Comprehensive -> multiple goals + mgm approaches
- Science-based
- Stakeholder-informed
- Created and managed with transparency to all
- Includes <u>existing MPAs</u> meeting NS criteria
- Will include <u>new or enhanced MPAs</u> created by action agencies to meet specific conservation needs












Priority Conservation Objectives - ex. Spawning Areas -








PCO Areas In and Outside of Existing MPAs






